**ORDER FURTHER EXTENDING  
TEMPORARY GENERAL ORDER  
2020-05**

On March 30, 2020, the Court issued General Order 2020-05 to authorize the use of video and telephone conferencing under the “Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act” (“CARES Act”). Pursuant to Section 15002(b)(3) of the CARES Act, General Order 2020-05 was effective for a period of 90 days, or until June 29, 2020, unless terminated earlier. As Chief Judge, I have extended General Order 2020-05 five times, for a 90-day period each time, until September 27, 2021. I have again reviewed the emergency conditions that led to the issuance of General Order 2020-05 and find that such emergency conditions continue to exist in the District of Nevada. Accordingly, as Chief Judge, and pursuant to Section 15002(b)(1) of the CARES Act, I hereby extend General Order 2020-05 for another 90 days, until December 27, 2021, unless that Order is terminated earlier.
